

# OPTION 1 (Full lesson) PROPS

## KINGDOM LIFE: LESSON 14 – THE BODY OF CHRIST

The following props are for use only with the full Storyboard Lesson (Option 1).

For the Condensed Lesson (Option 2) - see the Condensed Lesson Plan & Poster.

### Materials needed:

Essential:	Optional:
Colour printer (or take to print shop)	
Letter size card stock for printing (5 sheets)	1 sheet 11x17 inch card stock for puzzle
Scissors, pencil, Sharpie felt pen	1 craft foam sheet same size as puzzle
Piece of cardboard (same size as puzzle)	
Double sided tape or sticky tac to attach puzzle pieces to cardboard	
Small clear stick-on labels (one per person)	
9 peg dolls (3 men, 3 women, 3 children)	Paint for peg dolls – different skin colours (see instructions in lesson 1 props document)
A wall, poster or flannelgraph to make a Q&A poster.	
Sticky tac, stick-on Velcro or felt to attach teaching aids to display surfaces	

### Instructions for lesson props:

1. Print out pages 3-4 of this document in **black and white** on letter size card stock. Print out pages 5-6 in **colour** on letter size card stock. We recommend printing page 7 on 11x17 inch card stock for the puzzle if you need more than 10 puzzle pieces.
2. Cut out the symbols and word cards on pages 3-5. Keep page 6 as a whole poster. Make the picture of Jesus on page 7 into a puzzle. See instructions on page 2. (Write the lesson number on the back of the symbols, cards, and posters. If using flannelgraph, add Velcro or felt on the back.)
3. Create the Q&A poster on a display surface (see photo in lesson plan): The question is: "What does it mean to be part of the Body of Christ?" The answers are: We are the Church together, We are one body, Each part of the body is important, Jesus is our head. Cover the Question with "The Big Question" card, and cover the answers with the "Answer" cards. The children will pull off the cards during the lesson to reveal what is underneath.

**Instructions for making the Body of Christ puzzle:**

1. Cut out a piece of cardboard the same size as the picture on page 7. **Optional:** Glue the picture onto a craft foam sheet in the same size if you want thicker puzzle pieces.
2. Cut around the Jesus figure (pg 7), leaving the surrounding white area as intact as possible. Glue the surrounding area to the cardboard.
3. Draw puzzle shapes on the Jesus figure with pencil. You will need a puzzle piece for each child and adult in your class + a few extras for new or absent kids. Keep the head as a separate additional piece.
4. Cut out the puzzle shapes. Then draw on the cardboard base around each puzzle shape to create a guide for where the pieces should go. Write a number in each of the puzzle piece spaces on the cardboard base, and write the same number on the back of the corresponding puzzle piece.
5. Write the names of all the children and adult helpers on clear stickers.
6. As the children and helpers enter class, put their name sticker on a puzzle piece. If you have extra pieces, add the names of absent children or helpers. Do not put a name on the puzzle piece for Jesus' head. This piece represents Christ as the head of his body.
7. If you are not using the foam backing, double sided tape or sticky tac will be helpful to keep the puzzle pieces in place on the cardboard.

**Instructions for making the peg dolls:**

The peg dolls do not have to be painted, but if you choose to do so, there are painting instructions in the props document for lesson 1.
